

Exercise 2

Cross-examination of police officer by Mr. Black

Q: So the first time you went to the Ritz regarding this case is June 27th of 1997; is that correct?

Q: Not at all, right?

A: Right.

A: We did make a phone call to one of his employers.

Q: But not to him.

Further redirect examination by Prosecutor
