Exercise 8

(The fact situation is a tort action arising from a collision. On direct examination, the plaintiff, Mr. Zillman, testified that he was going only 45 miles an hour.)

QUESTION: Mr. Zillman, isn't it true that you testified on direct examination

you were going only 45 miles an hour at the time of the

accident?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it a fact that on August 3 of this year, you had a

conversation with Joan Navin at your house?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it correct that during that conversation, you discussed the

accident?

QUESTION: Isn't it also true that during that conversation, you told her that

your were going at least 55 miles an hour?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it a fact that in point of time, that conversation was closer

to the accident than your testimony today?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it correct that your memory was fresher then?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Your honor, may this be marked defense exhibit F for

identification?

QUESTION: May the record reflect that I am showing the exhibit to the

opposing counsel?

COURT: It will so reflect.

QUESTION: Mr. Zillman, I now hand you defense exhibit F for

identification. What is it?

WITNESS: It's a letter.

QUESTION: Isn't it true that the letter is in your handwriting?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it a fact that you wrote that letter?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it correct that on August 3 of this year, you wrote that

letter at your house?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it a fact that you then sent the letter to Ms. Joan Navin?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Let me direct your attention to the third paragraph on page one

of the exhibit. Isn't it true that in that paragraph, you wrote that

you were going at lease 55 miles an hour at the time of the

accident?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it true, in point of time, that the letter was closer to the

time of the accident than your testimony today?

WITNESS: Yes.

QUESTION: Isn't it a fact that your memory was fresher then?

WITNESS: Yes.
